

Lancers Rout W. Genesee, 12-2, In Lacrosse

LaFayette's Lancers rolled past West Genesee, 12-2, yesterday afternoon in the County League's championship lacrosse game at the LaFayette field.

The win left the Lancers and the Wildcats tied for the 1966 championship with 8-1 league records. There will be no play-off. The teams will reign as co-champions.

A crowd estimated in excess of 600 watched as the Lancers grabbed a 3-1 lead after one period of play and pushed their advantage to 5-2 at the halfway point. The winners added another goal in the third period and capped the day's scoring with a six-goal outburst in the last quarter.

Travis Cook and Ron Doctor led the winners with three goals each while Bob Shaw chipped in with two. Mark Werder, John Porter, Ron Hill and Clyde Jacques scored one goal apiece with Jacques also contributing five assists. Cutting had both West Genesee goals.

LaFayette, the area's highest scoring team with a 16.5 goal-per-game average (213-49), completed its overall season with a 12-1 record, the only loss coming at the hands of the Wildcats. The share of the championship enabled the Lancers to run their title string to four straight years.
